

Update – Charging Stations

Town staff applied for and received a grant for Tesla and Clipper Creek electric vehicle charging stations. The grants, available through Tesla, offer two Tesla charging stations for every one Clipper Creek. The latter offers charging to non-Tesla vehicles (e.g., Volt, Leaf, and other hybrids). Previous discussions proposed charging stations at the Government Center and at Rixey Moore Parking Lot on South Church Street. Town staff has done an initial assessment of electrical power available at the Government Center. The Building Committee has also discussed the request and will need to make the determination as to whether the stations could be placed at the Center. Modifications would need to occur at Rixey Moore before charging stations could be installed. Due to the removal of a light fixture and pole from damage as the result of a wind storm earlier this year, upgrades are needed to parking lot allowing the charging stations to be installed in the future.

Update – Rose Hill Park Master Plan

A surveyor has been contacted to update the existing survey of Rose Hill Park. The update will include the addition of utility locations; Town Run; identify the boundary of the playground area; and identify trees, tables, and walkways. Once the completed survey is obtained, the Committee can discuss ideas for future upgrades to the Park.

Discussion – FY 2020 Budget Goals

Previous discussions for budget items include playground upgrades; livery stabilization (the budget for this item was reduced in the current FY budget); replacing bricks in the tree dedication area around the gazebo; and lighting and other power needs for Rixey Moore Parking Lot.
